1. ON THE OTHER SIDE OF THIS SHEET, **WITHIN THE BLACK BOX AREA – WRITE YOUR LAST NAME WITH A MAGIC MARKER** (Safe-Wrap, which is set up in front of Miami & JFK airport check-in lines, has markers) – or download this sheet as a fill’able PDF from the link at the bottom of any CubaToDo.com page, type your name and print.
2. **GIVE SEVERAL OF THESE SHEETS TO THE PERSON WRAPPING YOUR BAG** AND have them put the sheets so that YOUR NAME WILL BE VISIBLE AFTER IT’S WRAPPED WITH THE “tamper resistant plastic film”.
3. WHEN YOU **ARRIVE AT THE AIRPORT IN CUBA** THIS SHEET WILL MAKE IT A LOT EASIER FOR YOU TO **IDENTIFY YOUR BAG ON THE LUGGAGE CAROUSEL** – AS THERE IS OVER 7,000 POUNDS OF WRAPPED BAGS ON THE AVERAGE U.S. – CUBA FLIGHT.
4. TIPPING THE BAG WRAPPER’S IS ALWAYS OPTIONAL – BUT APPRECIATED.
  - NOTES:
    - Wrapping your bag is of course optional (it costs \$15 per bag w/o \$5,000 guarantee & \$20 with guarantee), but generally you can identify luggage of non-Cuban passengers because their bags are not wrapped.
    - There is a lot of reports of petty theft of items from unwrapped checked baggage (with no way of knowing whether the theft occurred at the U.S. airport or the Cuban airport) – the items tend to be small (like sunglasses, pocket knives, small electronics, etc.) items sometimes not missed until you need them.
    - Hard sided luggage is less likely to see theft, while bags with lots of pockets (think back pack) is most at risk of items going missing.
    - An additional reason to secure your bag is “introduction of unauthorized items” - the unlikely event that someone working at the U.S. airport stashes something in your bag that an associate at the Cuban airport is supposed to remove – but does not get removed before you retrieve your bag.
    - If you do not wrap your bag, put a TSA approved lock on each zipper, or at a minimum a “zip tie” – we include zip tie’s, because even if you shrink wrap, you need to secure your bags on your return – as items sometimes disappear as they pass through the same airports, as bag wrapping is not available in Cuba.
    - Lastly, it may be possible to get your bag wrapped for less money before arriving at the airport, but if TSA opens your bag they remove the wrap, and **ONLY** bags in the blue Safe-Wrap color will be re-wrapped before leaving the U.S. airport – re-wrapping is included in the \$15 / \$20 price that you pay.
